

Dr. Armenio Suzano was born in Brazil and at the age of 15 won a competition to become the youngest member ever of the renowned Rio de Janeiro Opera House Symphony Orchestra (Orquestra do Teatro Municipal). He served as their Assistant Principal Clarinetist for 9 years.

Dr. Suzano's accomplishments include the Outstanding Music Graduate Award as well as the President's Award for Outstanding Performer of the Year from Stephen F. Austin State University (TX) and the 1st prize at the Sul-America International Competition in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. An avid soccer player and accomplished clarinetist and saxophonist, Suzano has conducted symphony orchestras and wind ensembles throughout the U.S., Russia, and Brazil.

Armenio Suzano is the winner the Solo and Aria Competition at Northwestern University and the winner of the Concerto Competition at the University of Michigan, where he was also a Humanities Fellow. He holds degrees from Stephen F. Austin State University (B.M.), Northwestern University (M.M.) and The University of Michigan (D.M.A.). He serves as Dean of the Greatbatch School of Music @ Houghton College in Houghton, N.Y. where he lives with his wife, Kelly VanKirk Suzano.

Praised for her musical maturity and masterful technique (Leipziger Volkszeitung), violinist Soo Yeon Kim is a dynamic violinist and educator empowering the audience through engaging performances. As a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestra player, she has appeared on concert stages throughout the world. As a soloist, Ms. Kim garnered both national and international recognition from winning several competitions in her native country, South Korea, and in the United States. Her recent winning of the

Eastman Concerto Competition allowed her to make her debut with the Eastman School Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Maestro Neil Varon in Kodak Hall at the Eastman Theatre. In addition to attending as a full-scholarship student at Juilliard, she was awarded several teaching fellowships in Music Theory and Music History Departments, assisting professors in both undergraduate and graduate classes. At Eastman, she held her own secondary violin teaching studio and was a studio teaching assistant of Mr. Robin Scott, teaching undergraduate students from the University of Rochester and Eastman. She is a former violin faculty at the Thurnauer School of Music, which is part of Kaplen JCC on the Palisades in NJ. Currently, she is an Assistant Professor of Violin and Viola at Houghton College in NY, where she is also the Director of Chamber Ensemble.

PROGRAM NOTES BY CLAUDIA STAINES

Ludwig van Beethoven 1770 - 1827

The Egmont Overture

His father tried to exhibit young Ludwig van Beethoven as a child prodigy, a gambit that failed for the rather cruel and alcoholic father, but still lead to the young musician being taken under the wing of Christian Neefe, who both employed and instructed him. He was also financially supported to a small degree by the Prince-Elector in Bonn. In 1792, Beethoven moved to Vienna, where he studied with Joseph Haydn among other teachers. Though he broke from the usual work pattern of seeking employment in the church or a royal court, the increasingly popular pianist and composer was able to support himself with sales of his work, public performances, and the occasional stipend from noblemen who recognized his musical gifts. Beethoven, much taken with the ideals of Enlightenment, as well as by the growing swell of Romanticism, dedicated his third symphony, the Eroica, to Napoleon. However, in 1804, Beethoven furiously crossed out the general's name after he had the temerity to crown himself Emperor! More important musically, Beethoven put his idea of true heroism, in battle especially, to the incidental music written for a play about Lamoral, Count of Egmont, a hero in the fight for the independence of the Netherlands. The theme of bravery and independence lead to the overture becoming the unofficial anthem for the Hungarian Revolution of 1956. Beethoven reportedly once said "Music is like a dream. One that I cannot hear." It is fortunate that others, like those revolutionaries, could.










Franz Peter Schubert 1797 - 1828

Symphony No. 8, in B Minor First Movement

Procrastinators, take warning from the sad tale of Franz Schubert. This gorgeous symphony, or what we have of it, was started in 1822 and... never finished, even though the composer lived for another six years after scoring the first two movements. He also nearly completed the piano score for a scherzo, but only managed to score two of those pages. There is still much debate about why Symphony No. 8 was never finished, perhaps a sign of how much music lovers and experts alike admire the piece. The two main ideas are either that he was distracted by the first illnesses caused by his syphilis or because he was taken up with the work that became the 'Wanderer Fantasy', or perhaps a combination of both. What is known about this symphony is that Schubert had been given an honorary diploma by the Graz Music Society. And in return, Schubert wanted to give the Society a gift, so dedicated the symphony to them. He sent the first two movements to Anselm Hüttenbrenner, a leading member. It is not truly understood why Hüttenbrenner squirreled away the manuscript, but it wasn't until 1865 (more than 40 years after Schubert's death) that he pulled it out and gave it to the prominent conductor, Johann von Herbeck. It is he who conducted the debut of this glorious work to a most enthusiastic Viennese audience in December 1865.

España, Rhapsody for Orchestra

Alexis-Emmanuel Chabrier 1841 - 1894

Back in the days when people could afford leisurely, six month tours in Europe, Chabrier and his wife, Marie Alice, traveled around Spain, visiting a number of towns and cities, taking in not just the glorious sights and delicious foods, but also the lively, sometimes haunting music and dance. In over a thousand letters to friends and colleagues written during the trip, Chabrier detailed everything he had learned, and what plans he had for musically capturing his trip once they returned. And, in fact, in early 1883, Chabrier began work on the rhapsody which became España. Originally intended to be a piano duet, the work grew into one for a full orchestra. It was dedicated to Charles Lamoureux, a great friend of the composer, and the man who conducted the first performance in October 1883. Although audiences and critics alike very much enjoyed the piece, Chabrier himself described it as "a piece in F and nothing more". The French composer was regarded to be an innovator, someone who would leave behind Wagnerian traits and try new idiom. Besides music, Chabrier had a great literary style and was a prolific letter writer, and was also an ardent art collector, especially of works by the Impressionists Cézanne, Monet, and Manet.


Violin Concerto, in E Minor, Opus 64 Allegro molto appassionato Jakob Ludwig Felix Mendelssohn Batholdy 1809 - 1847

In 1906, at his 75th birthday party, the celebrated Joseph Joachim, told his assembled friends and family that in his opinion "The Germans have violin concertos. The greatest, most uncompromising is Beethoven's. The one by Brahms vies with it in seriousness. The richest and most seductive was written by Max Bruch. But the most inward, the heart's jewel, is Mendelssohn's". Certainly it is a most popular concerto even today, considered to be essential for all concert violinists and most popular with classical music audiences. The idea for the concerto rattled around Mendelssohn's mind for a number of years. In a July 1838 letter to his great friend and colleague at the Leipzig Gewandhaus Orchestra, Ferdinand David, Mendelssohn said he hoped to have a violin concerto ready to give the concertmaster later in the year. While he wrote that the beginnings of the piece, in E minor, was already running through his head, it in fact took six years for him to finish the piece. This rather innovative work was first performed in Leipzig in March 1845, but because of Mendelssohn's ill health, he couldn't conduct. David was the soloist of course, and took up that role again in the fall of that same year, when Mendelssohn took the baton. Unlike other concertos, the piece throws open the performance with the immediate start of the violin solo, playing that same relentless E minor tune which was Mendelssohn's endless "ear worm".

Hoedown, from the ballet "Rodeo"

Aaron Copland 1900 - 1990

A hoedown, in the popular sense, is a dance of quick movement, related to the jig or reel. In fiddling, it a tune played in 2/4 time. In modern western square dance, a hoedown is the music used when a caller is at work exhorting dances to promenade. Tonight, a hoedown is a section of the Aaron Copland ballet "Rodeo".

Written in 1942, the ballet itself had five sections, but after the ballet's most enthusiastic reception, Copland went on to arrange the music as a symphonic suite for orchestra titled Four Dance Episodes from "Rodeo". He removed the middle section, "Ranch House Party", and made some other relatively minor adjustments to the overall structure and was left with what has become one of his most popular orchestral works. Copland was a great fan and supporter of American folk music, incorporating themes from many folk pieces into his work. "Rodeo", however, was different in that songs were not "sampled" but left intact and scored. Many experts credit Agnes de Mille, who was the choreographer-director-star of the ballet, and who had iron control over the production. The main theme of *HoeDown* is based on the song "Bonyparte", a traditional Kentucky folk fiddle tune. And if, in addition to hearing this glorious music by Copland, you happen to hear the sound of something sizzling on the grill, it's because this music was used by the American Beef Producers for their long-running campaign "Beef. It's What's For Dinner." Do you feel hungry now?

Video Games Live Suite based on the games Halo, Civilisation IV, Bounty Hunter, Kingdom Hearts arr Ralph Ford 1963 -

"Popular Science" stated that music on video games "simultaneously stimulates your senses and blends in to the background of your brain, because that's the point of the soundtrack. It has to engage you, the player, in a task without distracting from it. In fact, the best music would actually direct the listener to the task." When you think about it, this is the same message that studies done around the world have passed on. According to NeuroNation, there is music for every moment in our lives, whether we're tackling spring cleaning, studying for exams, struggling through heartbreak, or playing video games.

Music and sound effects which are memorable mean people recognize them outside of gaming, and will listen to the music separately, away from the console. Although popular, the composers are generally unknown to their audiences. The majority of composers are Japanese, but American musicians are catching up, and the industry's sound technology has improved so much that composers better known for their film work are now contributing to game soundtracks. Another side effect of the development of the quality of sound, and thus quality of music, is that the soundtracks are now being performed in concerts, like this one! Please feel free to share this knowledge of how music and gaming come together so well with your favorite gamer at home.

The author of these notes spent a fortnight in Spain a long time ago; regretfully, she was not compelled to write a rhapsody on her return. She adores Baryshnikov but please don't ask her to actually dance; she has keen political opinions but is unlikely to lead a revolution; and gaming requires strong hand-eye co-ordination, definitely not her forté. Fortunately, she has a gift for grilling steak to perfection and really, with some good music playing the background, does one need more?




